## **Recipe of the Month**

Classic Meat Loaf



Why do I love meatloaf? It reminds me of being a kid. Where else does one get meatloaf other than at home or a school cafeteria? You can often buy it already mixed at your local butcher. So all you have to do is add an egg and put it in a baking pan and plop it in the oven for an hour. But what if your butcher hasn't made up a batch? It's easy enough to make. Here's a recipe I use for traditional meat loaf. The ingredient that makes this meat loaf extra delicious is the spicy ground pork sausage. We once substituted this sausage for regular ground pork and have never looked back.

### **Ingredients**

5 cup of finely chopped onion

5 celery rib, chopped fine

5 Tbsp minced garlic

5 carrot, chopped fine or grated

2 ½ cup of finely chopped scallion (can substitute onion)

10 Tbsp unsalted butter

10 tsp salt (use 9 tsp if using Italian sausage)

7 ½ tsp freshly ground pepper

10 tsp Worcestershire sauce

3 ½ cup ketchup

7 ½ pounds of ground chuck

3 ¾ pound of spicy ground pork sausage (or use Italian sausage - 5 sweet, 5 hot)

(NOTE: many versions of meatloaf call for ground veal as well. I would experiment with a third each of beef, pork, and veal.)

5 cup fresh bread crumbs

8 large eggs, beaten slightly

1 ½ cup minced fresh parsley leaves

### Preparation

- Preheat oven to 350 degrees F.
- In a large heavy skillet cook the onion, garlic, celery, carrot, and scallion in butter, over moderate heat, stirring, for about 5 minutes. Cover and stir occasionally until the carrots are tender, about 5 more minutes. Stir in salt and pepper, Worcestershire sauce, and 1/3 a cup of ketchup. Cook for 1 more minute.
- In a large bowl, combine the meats, eggs, bread crumbs, vegetables, and parsley. Form into a loaf and put into a rectangular baking pan with 2 inch high sides. Cover loaf with remaining ketchup.
- Bake meat loaf in oven for approximately 1 hour.

Serves 20 to 30.
