# Greetings From Your Exalted Ruler John Stevens, PER



Please review the calendar for all of the events that we have coming up in the next couple of months. If any of them interest you we certainly could use the help to be sure that we are successful in each of them and I urge you to attend as many of the events as possible. Right now we really need school supplies for the coming year and will be making distribution shortly

The District Deputy Grand Exalted ruler will be conducting his annual audit and review of the Lodge and the conduct of the initiation

ritual on 7 September. I am a looking for a large turnout of our members to welcome him and support your officers as they perform the initiation ritual.

We have been hit recently with a large number of maintenance problems recently and that have hit our maintenance and repair budgets hard. These include oven repairs, replacement of the compressor for the walk in cooler, replacement of the panic bar on the front door, repairs to the drain behind the bar, failure of the security monitor and now the failure of one of the TV sets behind the bar. Further, income continues to decrease from the budgeted income while many of our expenses remain fixed.

Through the House Committee the following actions have been taken to help reduce costs and assure we are financially sound. We have laid off the paid bartender and will be running the bar with volunteers – need any help you the members can provide here as we really want to remain open. Many of the recent weeks the bar gross was less than the wages owed to the bartender. Pat had been a real asset and done a great job and we really hated to see him go but we had no other choice. We have also stopped the Friday and Saturday Happy Hours and ceased providing any free drinks though at least for the time being we will continue with the Thirsty Thursday promotion.

What can you do to help turn this around? One thing would be increase **attendance** at our dinners and functions. We also need volunteer bartenders to perform a shift or even a half shift – one person cannot do it all.

Our Flag retirement ceremony is scheduled for Saturday 11 September. The scouts really do an impressive job with this each year and I am sure that this year will be no different. Please plan to attend. Also for those with a birthday in September and October be on the lookout for your invitation in the mail. The dinner in August was a great success.

If your name appears on the delinquent list elsewhere in the bulletin I encourage you to renew your membership. If you want to discuss why you have let your membership lapse please contact me at the number included elsewhere in this bulletin.

If you any suggestions on how we can improve the Lodge and make it a place you want to come to more often please contact me.


